A ban on the disposal of electronics in Illinois landfills began on January 1, 2012. Therefore, the following electronics cannot be included in your trash, but must be properly disposed of:

## Snow Removal Policy



The goal of the City of Waterloo Public Works Department is to provide snow and ice control in a safe, timely and cost-efficient manner to the citizens of the City. Below are some highlights of the City's Snow Removal Policy and How Residents Can Help...

- Please park your car off-street whenever you can.
- Please make sure that basketball goals and other obstructions are not placed in or adjacent to the street.
- The City often receives calls regarding snowplow trucks depositing snow at the end of driveways or in front of mailboxes. Attempts will be made to keep excessive amounts from accumulating; however, this is a reality of snow plowing, and it cannot be helped. Property owners are responsible for cleaning their driveway approaches and around mailboxes.
- City plows could make several trips down your street in the attempt to keep it clear. This may result in snow being thrown back into your driveway after you have shoveled it.
- The City will not be responsible for plowing alleys.
- If you have a neighbor who is unable to remove the snow from their driveway or in front of their mailbox, please assist them in removing the snow.
