The contest categories are listed below:

Coloring Contest for pre-school ages 3 through 5 and those in kindergarten. The coloring sheets are available at City Hall or may be downloaded at www.waterloo.il.us.

April 1st is the deadline for submitting an entry in this contest. Entries can be dropped off at City Hall, 100 West Fourth Street. First, second and third place prizes will be awarded in each category and age group. Winners and their parents will be invited to an Awards Presentation and Loyalty Dinner on Saturday, May 4th at the Millstadt VFW Post #7980.

Are You Heart Healthy?

February is the month dedicated to raising awareness about heart disease.

- Every year, about 600,000 people die of heart disease in the United States
- Heart disease is the leading cause of death for both men and women.
- About 935,000 Americans have a heart attack in a year.

Because early action is very important, do you know the warning signs and symptoms? Help you or your loved ones prevent death or injury by knowing these warning signs:

- Chest pain or discomfort
- Upper body pain or discomfort in the arms, back, neck, jaw, or upper stomach
- · Shortness of breath
- Nausea, lightheadedness, or cold sweats

Many sudden cardiac deaths occur outside a hospital. This suggests that many people with heart disease don't act on early warning signs. Most recognize chest pain as a symptom of a heart attack, but knowing all major symptoms and knowing to call 911 when someone is experiencing a heart attack is what saves lives.
