Building Permits
With Spring often comes home improvement projects. Please keep in mind that building permits are required for all new construction, additions and accessory structures over fifty square feet, including porches, decks, swimming pools and storage sheds. Permits are not required for fences, but fencing heights, setbacks and easements must be taken into consideration. Call 811 for utility marking prior to any digging

Commercial building permits are required for all new construction, additions or structural, electrical or plumbing modifications. Commercial building permits are also required for change of occupancy.
