April Showers Bring May Flowers...and Tall Grass!

With Spring in full bloom, a few things to remember:

- -All grass must be kept below a maximum height of 8"in accordance with City of Waterloo ordinance 29-8-8 Weeds.
- -Trim bushes around your utility meters so your meters can be read accurately.
- -The City of Waterloo does not pickup tree limbs and branches. However, the City of Waterloo yard waste site is available to city residents.

Don't forget your drainage! Spring storms often leave behind water problems. Be proactive by cleaning out guttering, maintaining adequate foundation backfill that allows water to drain away from your home and clear any storm sewer inlets on your property. The City of Waterloo is not responsible for clearing debris from storm sewers on easements.

Large Item Pick-Up Day Scheduled for April 23rd

The City of Waterloo has contracted with Reliable Sanitation to pickup household items, that are not included in our regular scheduled pickup. Please note not all items are allowed, such as televisions, tires, doors, toilets, etc. For a complete list of unacceptable items, please visit the City's website, www.waterloo.il.us. Also, each household is limited to 2 items.

Building Permits

With Spring often comes home improvement projects. Please keep in mind that building permits are required for all new construction, additions and accessory structures over fifty square feet, including porches, decks, swimming pools and storage sheds. Permits are not required for fences, but fencing heights, setbacks and easements must be taken into consideration. Call 811 for utility marking prior to any digging or excavation.

Commercial building permits are required for all new construction, additions or structural, electrical or plumbing modifications. Commercial building permits are also required for change of occupancy.
