Snow Removal Policy

The goal of the Waterloo Public Works Department is to provide snow and ice control in a safe, timely and cost-efficient manner. Below are a few highlights of the City's Snow Removal Policy and How Residents Can Help.....

- Please park your car off-street whenever you can.
- Please make sure that basketball goals and other obstructions are not placed in or adjacent to the street.
- Attempts will be made to keep excessive amounts of snow from accumulating at the end of driveways or in front of mailboxes. However, this is a reality of snow plowing and cannot be helped. Property owners are responsible for cleaning their driveway approaches and around mailboxes.
- The City will not be responsible for plowing alleys.
- If you have a neighbor who is unable to remove the snow from their driveway or in front of their mailbox, please assist them in removing the snow.

Prevent Carbon Monoxide Poisoning

Carbon monoxide poisoning is a silent, deadly killer claiming about 1,000 lives each year. Such common items such as auto exhaust, home heating systems & obstructed chimneys can produce the colorless, odorless gas. Be sure to follow these tips:

- Replace the battery for your home's CO detector each spring and fall
- Do not heat your home with a gas range or oven
- Never run a car or truck inside an attached garage
- Never run generators indoors; open a window slightly when using a kerosene heater
- Never use charcoal to cook indoors
