Each year, 1 in 10 American teenagers suffer physical violence at the hands of a boyfriend or girlfriend, and many others are sexually or emotionally abused. Dating violence can inflict long-lasting pain, putting survivors at increased risk of substance abuse, depression, poor academic performance, and experiencing further violence from a partner. Although girls and young women ages 16 to 24 are at the highest risk, dating violence can affect anyone. That is why everyone must learn the risk factors and warning signs. While healthy relationships are built on fairness, equality, and respect, dating violence often involves a pattern of destructive behaviors used to exert power and control over a partner. It can include constantly monitoring, isolating, or insulting a partner; extreme jealousy, insecurity, or possessiveness; or any type of physical violence or unwanted sexual contact. The City of Waterloo will offer immediate and confidential support and remains dedicated to preventing dating violence, raising awareness among teens and their families, and educating young people about healthy relationships. Alongside schools, communities, and advocacy groups, we are working to change attitudes and help teens speak out against dating violence.

Each of us can play a role in ending dating violence -- in our schools, our homes, our neighborhoods, and our dormitories. This month and throughout the year, let every American look out for one another, stand with survivors, speak out against dating violence, and build communities where abuse is never tolerated.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Thomas Smith, Mayor of the City of Waterloo, IL, do hereby proclaim February 2015 as Teen Dating Violence Awareness and Prevention Month. 
# WATERLOO FIRE DEPARTMENT MEMORIAL BELL PLAZA

A New Place Of Honor For The Waterloo Fire Department "Memorial Bell" Show Your Support For Waterloo Firefighters... Past, Present, and Future

When it was decided the The Waterloo Fire Protection District needed a new fire station to better meet the needs of an evergrowing community, a state-of-the-art facility was designed and constructed. But when this modern firehouse was completed, there was one glaring omission... an omission that not only looked to the future, but recognized the past, as well.

A large bronze bell has graced the front of the Waterloo Fire Department engine house on Main Street since its construction in 1961 and hung at the old Firehouse/City Hall on Fourth Street since its dedication in 1934. The bell can be traced back further, perhaps to 1894, actually predating official foundation of the Waterloo Fire Company in 1898.

In its early years, this bronze bell was rung to alert stalwart volunteers of fire calls. In recent years, it has remained a cherished symbol of a bygone era...an era of unflinching dedication by a handful of men who, when called upon, stepped forward to come to the assistance of their neighbors. So, what are we to do with our bell?




The proposed Waterloo Fire Department Memorial Bell Plaza was conceived to honor the men who've stepped forward to help their community in its time of need.

The Memorial's four brick pillars and the organic shape of the steel carriage represents the solid foundation of community support the Fire Department has always enjoyed. In the center, the honored bell is suspended overhead.




