### ORDINANCE NO. 1710

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF WATERLOO, ILLINOIS REVISED CODE OF ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 7 BUSINESS CODE, ARTICLE 5 RAFFLE CODE.

# BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WATERLOO, ILLINOIS AS FOLLOWS:

**SECTION ONE.** City of Waterloo, Illinois Revised Code of Ordinances, Chapter 7 Business Code, Article 5 Raffle Code, shall be amended by adding the following underlined language so that it will read in its entirety as follows:

### 7-5-1 RAFFLE CODE, <u>INCORPORATION OF STATE LAW</u>

The City of Waterloo, Illinois hereby adopts by reference herein 230 ILCS 15/0.01 et. seq., as it shall be amended from time to time, for the regulation of Raffles and Poker Runs.

### 7-5-2 APPROVAL OF LICENSES AND WAIVER OF BOND

Application for a raffle license shall be made to the City Clerk or the Clerk's designee and shall be approved or disapproved by the Mayor. Waiver of bond shall be approved or disapproved by the Mayor.

### 7-5-3 <u>SALE OF RAFFLE CHANCES AT LICENSED LIQUOR</u> <u>ESTABLISHMENTS BY PERMIT</u>

- (A) All licensed liquor establishments may sell raffle chances, on behalf of any person or entity licensed by the City of Waterloo to conduct raffles, including themselves, but only by permit received from the Mayor/Liquor Commissioner.
- (B) Application for said permit shall be on a form approved by the Mayor/Liquor Commissioner. A fee of \$1.00 is required and the permit is valid for one (1) year from date of issuance.
- (C) The permit must be prominently displayed in the licensed liquor establishment.

**SECTION TWO.** All other ordinances, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

**SECTION THREE.** This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law.
