2022 Large Item Pickup Dates

The City of Waterloo has contracted with Reliable Sanitation to pickup household items, that are not included in our regular scheduled pickup, four times each year. A special truck will be used on these days. Such items to include are old appliances, furniture, etc. that is too large to be included in the regular pickup. Doors, compressors, and electric motors must be removed from appliances.

Please keep large items and regular trash pickup items separate. Items must be placed next to the curb and ready for pick up by 6:00 am. Limit 2 items per household.

This year, Reliable Sanitation has split the city in half for large item pick-up. A map showing the split, along with a list of items that are not allowed, is available on our website at http://www.waterloo.il.us/our-community/trash-recycling/large-item-pickup/.

Prepare Your Car for Winter

It's never too late to prepare your car for cold weather. Just a few steps can have you prepared for freezing temperatures:

- Service the radiator and maintain antifreeze level, check tire tread or, if necessary, replace tires with all-weather or snow tires.
- Keep the gas tank full to avoid ice in the tank and fuel lines.
- Use a wintertime windshield washer fluid.
- Prepare a winter emergency kit to keep in your car in case you become stranded.
 The kit should include a cell phone charger and extra batteries; blankets; food and
 water; booster cables, flares, tire pump and bag of sand or cat litter (for traction);
 flashlight, battery-powered radio and extra batteries; and first aid kit. Source: cdc.gov
