Water Line Identification

The IEPA is requiring the City to identify all water service lines in residential homes built **prior to 1985**. To simplify the process, we will be sending out surveys asking homeowners to confirm the type of waterline coming into their home (Copper, Galvanized, or Plastic). Pictures of each will be referenced on the survey. All you need to do is check (X) the appropriate box, sign, date and return the survey to City Hall by the referenced date. If you would like someone from City Hall to verify your water service line for you (this will take less than five minutes), we will be happy to do so. Per City Ordinance, it is unlawful for any person, firm, co-partnership or corporation to offer for sale, expose for sale, sell at retail or use or explode any fireworks within the city limits. Please help keep our neighborhoods safe.



Grass Clippings

Mowing the lawn is such a mundane activity, that we tend not to think about where our grass clippings end up. Please be aware that grass clippings on the street cause major problems and safety concerns:

- Grass clippings are often blown or left in the road, which can lead to serious injuries or even death for motorcyclists. For motorcyclists, grass clippings can be as slippery and hazardous as black ice, especially on curves.
- Grass clippings and other yard waste blown into the street can cause localized flooding by clogging curb inlets and pipes.
- Grass clippings in the street can also affect our water quality and harm aquatic wildlife by causing high levels of nutrients in local creeks and streams.
